Food Pantry

Our opening day was September 1, 2016. We are located at 512 Winter Street (at the Corner of Church St. and Winter St.) in Old Forge, Pennsylvania. We plan to be open the first Thursday of the month and the third Saturday of each month from 11 AM to Noon. Each family who qualifies and lives in Old Forge, Taylor or Duryea will be able to obtain food and non-food items once a month.

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) is operated in accordance with United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) policy, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability. Eligibility is based upon the income guidelines listed below. They must be at, or below, the income level indicated to be eligible for program benefits.
