[(321-ctr) Hebrews 9:11-14] Brethren: When Christ appeared as a High Priest of the good things to come, then through the greater and more perfect tabernacle (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation) * He entered once for all into the Holy Place, through not the blood of goats and calves but His own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption. * For if the sprinkling of defiled persons with the blood of goats and bulls and with the ashes of a heifer sanctifies for the purification of the flesh, * how much more shall the blood of Christ, Who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, purify your conscience from dead works to serve the living God.

[(208) Galatians 3:23-29] Brethren: Before faith came, we were confined under the law, kept under restraint until faith should be revealed. * So that the law was our custodian until Christ came, that we might be justified by faith. * But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a custodian; * for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. * For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. * There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus. * And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise.

GOSPELS

[(47) Mark 10:32-45] At that time, taking the twelve, Jesus began to tell them what was to happen to Him, * saying, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem; and the Son of Man will be delivered to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn Him to death, and deliver Him to the Gentiles; * and they will mock Him, and spit upon Him, and scourge Him, and kill Him; and after three days He will rise." * And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Him, and said to Him, "Teacher, we want Thee to do for us whatever we ask of Thee." * And He said to them, "What do ye want Me to do for you?" * And they said to Him, "Grant us to sit, one at Thy right hand and one at Thy left, in Thy glory." * But Jesus said to them, "Ye do not know what ye are asking. Are ye able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" * And they said to Him, "We are able." And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink ye will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, ye will be baptized; * but to sit at My right hand or at My left is not Mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." * And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. * And Jesus called them to Him and said to them, "Ye know that those who are supposed to rule over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. * But it shall not be so among you; but whoever would be great among you must be your servant, * and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. * For the Son of Man also came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."

[(33) Luke 7:36-50] At that time, one of the Pharisees asked Jesus to eat with him, and He went into the Pharisee's house, and took His place at table. * And behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that He was at table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of ointment, * and standing behind Him at His feet, weeping, she began to wet His feet with her tears, and wiped them with the hair of her head, and kissed His feet, and anointed them with the ointment. * Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw it, he said to himself, "If this Man were a prophet, He would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner." * And Jesus answering said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to thee." And he answered, "What is it, Teacher?" * "A certain creditor had two debtors; one owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. * When they could not pay, he forgave them both. Now which of them will love him more?" * Simon answered, "The one, I suppose, to whom he forgave more." And He said to him, "Thou hast judged rightly." * Then turning toward the woman He said to Simon, "Seest thou this woman? I entered thy house, thou gavest me no water for My feet, but she has wet My feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. * Thou gavest Me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not ceased to kiss My feet. * Thou didst not anoint My head with oil, but she has anointed My feet with ointment. * Therefore I tell thee. her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much; but he who is forgiven little, loves little." * And He said to her, "Thy sins are forgiven." * Then those who were at table with Him began to say among themselves, "Who is this, Who even forgives sins?" * And He said to the woman, "Thy faith has saved thee; go in peace."

Hebrews 9:11 The Body as Tabernacle Veil in Heaven. St John Chrysostom: Well did he say, "greater and more perfect tent," since God the Word and all the power of the Spirit dwells therein, "for it is not by measure that he gives the Spirit." "More perfect," as being both without blame and setting right greater things. "That is, not of this creation"—see how it was greater, for it would not have been "of the Spirit," if humankind had constructed it. Nor yet is it "of this creation," that is, not of these created things, but spiritual, of the Holy Spirit.

See how he calls the body tent and curtain and heaven: "Through the greater and more perfect tent." "Through the curtain, that is, through his flesh." And again, "into the inner shrine behind the curtain." And again, "entering into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God." Why then does he say this? In accordance

with whether one thing or another is signified. I mean, for instance, the heaven is a curtain, for as a curtain it walls off the Holy of Holies; the flesh is a curtain hiding the Godhead; and the tent likewise holds the Godhead. Again, heaven is a tent, for the priest is there within. On the Epistle to the Hebrews 15.4.

Luke 7:37-38: Symbols of the Lord's Teaching. St Clement of Alexandria: That woman had not yet entered communion with the Word, because she was still a sinner. She paid the Master honor with what she considered the most precious thing she had, her perfume. She wiped off the remainder of the perfume with the garland of her head, her hair. She poured out upon the Lord her tears of repentance. Therefore her sins were forgiven her.

This is a symbol of the Lord's teachings and of his sufferings. The anointing of his feet with sweet-smelling myrrh suggests the divine teaching whose good smell and fame has spread to the ends of the earth. "Their sound has gone forth to the ends of the earth." Moreover, those anointed feet of the Lord (not to be too subtle) are the apostles. The sweet odor of the myrrh prefigures their reception of the Holy Spirit. I mean that the figure of the Lord's feet is to be understood of the apostles, who journeyed about the whole world preaching the gospel. Christ the Educator 2.8.

A Guide to the Triodion & Lent 10. Fifth Sunday of Great Lent - Sunday of Saint Mary of Egypt

On the fifth Sunday of Fast, we are enjoined to celebrate the memory of our Holy Mother Mary of Egypt.

The Church service for this Sunday is devoted to the memory and glorification of the spiritual efforts of Saint Mary of Egypt, who "has cut down with the sword of abstinence the desires of your soul and the passions of your flesh. You have choked your sinful thoughts with the silence of the ascetic life, and have watered all the wilderness with the streams of your tears, and caused the fruits of repentance to spring up for us" and "with works of Lenten fasting", "as sun she shines revealed as a guide to all who have sinned".

In her life the Holy Church pays attention to two contrasts: on the depth of her sinful falling and on the height of her graceful rising; it points out that true repentance wipes away the very heaviest sins, and can uplift the repenting trespasser to a high degree of spiritual perfection.

The story of Saint Mary's life was written down by Saint Sophronios, Patriarch of Jerusalem.

The Life of Saint Mary of Egypt is read during Great Lent along with the Great Canon of Saint Andrew,

Archbishop of Crete.
