Brief Introduction to the Akathist Hymn

he Akathist Hymn is a profound, devotional poem or chant, which sings the praises of the Holy Mother and Ever-Virgin Mary (Theotokos). It is chanted in all Orthodox Churches throughout the world during the five Fridays in the Great Lent, and constitutes a very concrete spiritual preparation for the Holy Week and Easter Services.

Devotional Hymns to the Theotokos are as ancient as the first Christian Church. The Byzantine Empire from its very inception at Constantinople during the fourth century, closely allied itself to the Virgin Mary and always looked for Her protection and intercessions. This we see from the Prayer Services to the Theotokos between the fifth and eighth centuries, and the reference to Constantinople as the 'Queen City'.

The Akathist Hymn, which in its present form was added to by many Ecclesiastical Hymnographers, existed for most part even before it was formally accepted by the Church in 626 AD.

Reader: Amen. Most glorious, Ever-Virgin, Mother of Christ God, present our prayer to thy Son and our God, that through thee, He may save our souls.

My hope is the Father, my refuge is the Son, my protection is the Holy Spirit: O Holy Trinity, glory to Thee.

All my hope I place in thee, O Mother of God: keep me under thy protection.

Priest: Glory to Thee O Christ Our God and our only sure hope, glory to Thee!

Rejoice, O immaculate one, higher than the heavens, who without pain carried within you the Foundation of the Earth. Rejoice, O seashell that dipped in your blood the divine purple for the King of the Powers of Heaven.

Priest: Ready-voiced orators we see become voiceless as fish before you, O Theotokos, and unable to say how you could give birth and yet remain a virgin; but we, marveling at this mystery, cry out in faith:

Rejoice, vessel of the Wisdom of God;
Rejoice, treasury of His foreknowledge.
Rejoice, you who shows the learned to be fools;
Rejoice, you who proves logicians illogical.
Rejoice, for the subtle disputants are made fools;
Rejoice, for the makers of myths are made to fade away.
Rejoice, you who dispersed the word-webs of the Athenians;

Rejoice, you who filled the nets of the fishermen. Rejoice, you who draws us up from the depths of ignorance;

Rejoice, you who enlightens many with knowledge. Rejoice, raft for those who wish to be saved; Rejoice, haven for those who swim in the sea of life. **Rejoice, O Bride without bridegroom!**

Kontakion 10

Priest: Salvation for the world the Architect of all desired, and to this end by His own will He came; as God from everlasting He is our shepherd, yet as man He appeared among us for our sake, and although called like by like, still as God He hears: Alleluia!

Choir: Alleluia. (3)

Priest: Present and complete with those below, and in no wise absent from those above was the Uncircumscribed Word; for there took place indeed a divine Descent and not a simple change of place; and the Birth was from a God-chosen Virgin, who heard such words as these:
